The Wutai Shan Buddhist Garden is the largest Buddhist institution in Canada. It features a main Buddha Hall fronted by an enormous Buddha. The Hall construction is based on ancient Chinese large interlocking wooden brackets (no nails) made of rosewood. The Hall has many Buddhist features including 22,000 smaller carved buddhas. Across the landscape are platforms and gardens to visit throughout the property. We'll have a tour guide.
